The centers continue to provide programs and services based on the use of expanded and shared resources. Members are able to participate in after school programs, counseling programs, expanded activities and events for teens, youth sports programs, family support programs and more! Here are a few examples:

1. One of the wonderful programs happening at our Neighborhood Development Center in Trotwood is the “Healthy Kids Program.” Each weekday, students grades 3-5 from Broadmoor Elementary School, receive homework assistance, nutritional snacks, health screenings, wellness instruction and discover the advantages of an active lifestyle through exercise and sports. Community partners include the City of Trotwood, United Theological Seminary, Dayton Center Courts and Tennis Academy, Trotwood Madison Schools, Babolat Tennis Equipment, and Dayton Area Tennis Association.
