Eclipse frequently asked questions

- Can I use regular sunglasses to view a solar eclipse? <u>Answer</u>: No, regular sunglasses do not provide sufficient protection. Specialized solar viewing glasses are necessary to safeguard your eyes.
- What is the best way to observe a solar eclipse without proper equipment? <u>Answer:</u> Create a pinhole projector with a box and a sheet of paper. This simple projector is a safe way to indirectly view the eclipse.
- 3. Are there specific times during a solar eclipse when it's safe to look without protection? Answer: No, it's never safe to look directly at the Sun during a solar eclipse without proper eye protection, even during partial phases.
- 4. Are there any specific safety guidelines for children during a solar eclipse? <u>Answer:</u> Children should be closely supervised and provided with proper eye protection. Never allow them to look at the Sun directly, even during an eclipse.
- 5. Can I use my solar glasses with my telescope or binoculars? Answer: No, Solar eclipse glasses are ONLY for your eyes. Never point a telescope or binoculars at the Sun unless you have proper telescope or binocular solar eclipse filters.
