Trotwood Madison City Schools has been named a recipient of the Momentum Award by the Ohio Department of Education, marking a significant milestone for the district.

The Ohio Momentum Award is one of the state's most competitive recognitions for academic performance. To earn it, a district or school must improve its Performance Index by at least three points from the previous year and achieve a value-added Progress Rating of 4 or more stars.

This means students are not only achieving progress at higher levels, but learning at a faster rate than expected.

The district saw an overall increase in its Performance Index of 6.3 points, while Trotwood Madison High School saw an increase of 11.6 point

“This award belongs to every student who showed up and worked hard, and every staff member who refused to give up on them,” said Superintendent Marlon Howard.

“We made a promise that we would pursue 100 percent student success, not as a slogan, but as a real commitment. These numbers show that we are moving in the right direction. We still have work to do, and we are absolutely going to do it.”

Working Outside of Ohio – Are You Covered?

Some states require their *own* workers' compensation coverage if an employee works there, even for a short time. To avoid fines, penalties, or stop-work orders, employers should understand extraterritorial coverage and Other States Coverage.

Extraterritorial Coverage (What Ohio Already Provides)

If your Ohio employees work *temporarily* in another state, the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation (BWC) usually still covers them.

There is no set time limit as long as the work is only temporary and connected to their Ohio job.

Other States Coverage (Optional Protection)

Sometimes, another state may not accept Ohio's coverage. When that happens, you could face coverage gaps or penalties.

Ohio offers an optional Other States Coverage policy to help with this.

This optional policy:

- Fills any gaps in coverage
- Protects your business from penalties or stop-work orders in other states
- Keeps employees covered at an affordable price
